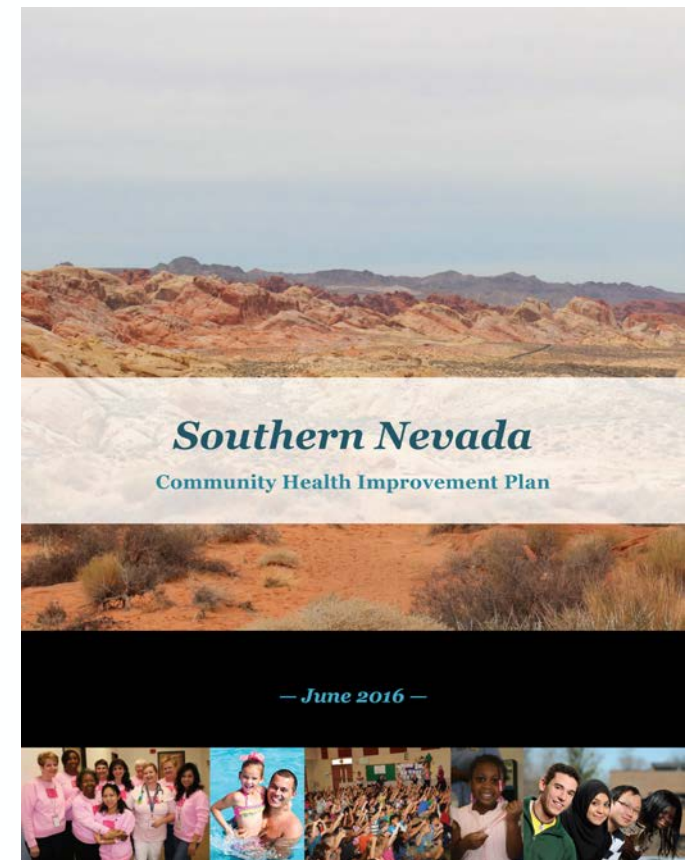

# 1: ACCESS TO CARE

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- ▶ **Mobile Unit-Providing services to the underserved**
  - ▶ 7 regularly scheduled clinics at 5 different sites
  - ▶ 584 vaccinations to 273 clients provided (Jan, 2018-Feb 2019)
  - ▶ Collaborations with Clark County Libraries, YMCA, recreation centers, and City of Henderson
- ▶ **Rural Efforts- (Included Tonopah, Goldfield, Pahrump, Ely, McGill, Mesquite, and Beatty)**
  - ▶ 129 clients seen for dental services
  - ▶ 102 vaccinations provided to 57 clients
  - ▶ Collaborations with Nevada State Oral Health Program, Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public and Behavioral Health, and community leaders

## ACCESS TO CARE CONT.

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### ▶ Outreach Immunizations/ Referral services

- Hard to reach and underserved populations: Mexican Consulate, Clean Needle Exchange, low income schools, Mobile Health Collaborative
  - ▶ 1449 vaccines provided to 675 clients
- Homeless community: shelters, encampments, homeless youth center, and tunnels
  - ▶ 621 vaccinations provided to 262 clients (Jan 2018- Feb 2019)
  - ▶ Collaborations with AIDS Healthcare Foundation, HELP of Southern Nevada, Trac B, Las Vegas Rescue Mission, City of Las Vegas, Nevada Homeless Alliance, and Immunize Nevada

### ▶ Mobile Health Collaborative

- Provides multiple medical, behavioral, and social services
- Collaboration with UNLV School of Medicine, CHIP, Nevada Homeless Alliance, and community partners

- ▶ Southern Nevada Health District's Chronic Disease Prevention Program and Tobacco Prevention Program successfully collaborated with community partners on many initiatives this year.

# CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION PROGRAM

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## ▶ Healthy Vending Resolution

- ▶ Three 100% healthy snack vending machines will be piloted at UNLV and 35% of food/beverage in all other machines meet nutrition standards

## ▶ Healthy School Lunches

- ▶ Partnered with CCSD to increase number of elementary schools participating in rotating salad bar program.
- ▶ Prior to our intervention, 21 elementary schools took the rotating salad bar
- ▶ During this intervention, 43 NEW schools took the salad bar
- ▶ Resulted in an increase from 9% of schools to 28%

## ▶ Slam Dunk Health Challenge- > 13,000 students

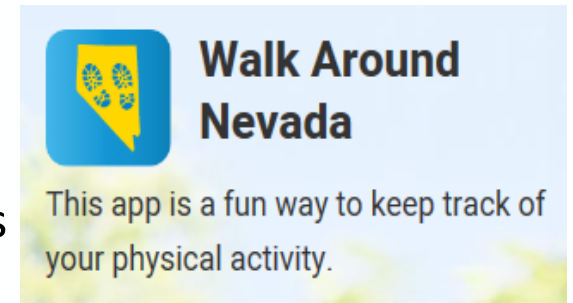
- ▶ SNHD, CCSD, and the Las Vegas Aces WNBA team
- ▶ Program encourages physical activity and fruit and vegetable consumption in elementary school students



## CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION CONT.

### ▶ Walk around Nevada Worksite Wellness

- ▶ Worked with the Health Coaches at MGM properties to integrate the Walk Around Nevada (WAN) program and mobile app as part of ongoing health and wellness efforts at MGM properties.



- ▶ Approximately 1,048 MGM employees participated in the challenge. At the end of the challenge MGM employees reported walking 151,015 total miles during the 5-week challenge.

### ▶ Move Your Way

- ▶ Raising awareness of the updated Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans and coordinating a pilot project to launch the campaign (e.g., 5K Walk/Run event)
- ▶ Southern NV was one of two locations in the country selected
- ▶ Collaboration with CDC, US HHS, and Partners for a Healthy Nevada





## TOBACCO PREVENTION PROGRAM (TPP)

- ▶ Coordinated the 2018 Nevada Adult Tobacco User Survey
  - ▶ Over 571 Nevadan's participated in the survey.
  - ▶ Identified users' practices, perceptions of harm and cessation attempts in populations at greater risk for using tobacco
- ▶ Implemented 12 youth-focused tobacco prevention events in high schools
  - ▶ Reached an estimated 24,000 youth
  - ▶ promoted on youth-focused social media platforms



## **TOBACCO PREVENTION PROGRAM (TPP)**



- ▶ Supported the Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority (SNRHA) in the implementation of their smoke-free rules.
  - ▶ Technical assistance, resources, and educational materials for 20 conventional public housing properties, 6 senior developments, 4 elderly/disabled developments and 10 family sites totaling 2,651 units with over 5,400 residents
- ▶ Electronic referrals to NV Tobacco Quitline
  - ▶ TPP staff worked with University Medical Center to implement bi-directional electronic referral to the Nevada Tobacco Quitline via the UMC electronic health record system.
- ▶ Secured 12 weeks of nicotine replacement therapy
  - ▶ for populations who have been disproportionately burdened by tobacco use who contact the Quitline.

## 3. POLICY AND FUNDING

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- ▶ Upcoming regulation/policy changes
  - NAC 441A.040 Communicable Disease
    - ▶ Multiple diseases/organisms will be added to the Reportable Diseases, Conditions for Nevada
  - E-cigarettes tax
  - AB97- Public Health Improvement Fund
  - NV Clean Indoor Air Act Modernization
- ▶ REACH Grant (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health)
  - ▶ 5 year grant, \$800K to support culturally and linguistically appropriate strategies in tobacco, physical activity and nutrition

## ADDITIONAL FUNDING SECURED IN 2018-2019

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- ▶ Additional funds will support projects such as:
  - ▶ Nevada Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program
  - ▶ HIV/Hepatitis Testing in Clark County Detention Center
  - ▶ Partnership with the Clark County Coroner's office to abstract Opioid Overdose and Violent Death data and report to state and community partners
  - ▶ PrEP Navigation- HIV Prevention efforts
